We were talked down to and he talked way too much about his personal experience
Wanted more focus on DSM5 changes.
Very poor organization of material
Very knowledgeable but spent too much time talking about his research/what he proposes vs. what was on the agenda for the day, wanted to hear about PDM, difficult to hear and would trail off at times.
very knowledgeable and engaging at times
Very good presenter. Can go off on tangents at times, but not too problematic
Very good at what he does and I enjoyed it but a bit too much personal and anecdote material
Very frustrating with clip on mic
Very experienced and knowledgeable
Very Dynamic Speaker
Tremendous amount of knowledge however sometimes leads to tangents that were difficult to follow, he is extremely intelligent
Tremendously stimulating
This could have been condensed in one day
Tended to wander off topic - a bit disorganized
Stories were interesting but not always beneficial. Core of material I was interested in DSM changes, transition to ICD could have been covered in 2-3 hours
Speaks from an evolutionary presupposition as its been proven but engaging, often tangential in confusing ways.
Spoke too quickly for me
Some words were dropped but made content interesting
Some very interesting info just now that I expected
Problem with microphone
Presentation was often difficult to follow due to disorganization. He often provided anecdotes to illustrate his point but they often seemed off topic. I would have preferred to hear more about the DSM-5 rather than Dr. Gordon
power points are too wordy, he is a little long winded
Personable and interesting but tended to go off target
Not what I expected
Not knowledgeable about DSM5
Not enough info on the DSM 5, course should be more specific
Needs to hold back on psychoanalysis a bit. We came for the DSM5/ICD 10, seemed like a big advertisement for his new model and for psychoanalysis, not what I signed up for and very inappropriate to use of CEU time to fill out his form
