The research and testimony of Debra and her colleagues have influenced change in child welfare policy and laws on local and national levels.

Debra's clinical background includes child and family therapy and supervision, specifically with child abuse cases. Her publications include *Revisiting Child Abuse Reporting Laws*, and *Social Policy, Child Abuse and Neglect*, and *Forensic Psychiatry*.

Debra has held leadership roles in the child welfare arena for over 30 years and directed innovative child welfare programs nationally, including the New York Foundling Hospital's Crisis Nursery and Boston City Hospital's Sexual Abuse Team.

Linda K. Knauss, Ph.D., ABPP is a Professor at Widener University's Institute for Graduate Clinical Psychology and the former Director of Internship Training there. Dr. Knauss is the Past-chair of the American Psychological Association's Ethics Committee, the American Board of Professional Psychology's Ethics Committee, the Pennsylvania Psychological Association's Ethics Committee, and has served as Co-chair of the Philadelphia Society of Clinical Psychologists' Ethics Committee.

Dr. Knauss taught courses in ethics at Widener University, Immaculata University, and the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine. She has authored several book chapters and journal articles on ethics, and has taught many continuing education workshops on a variety of ethical issues. In addition to her work at Widener University, Dr. Knauss maintains a private clinical practice where she sees children, adolescents, adults, and families.
