**Overview:** Treating suicidal clients is both challenging and stressful. Effective treatment of suicidal patients includes a thorough assessment, lethal means counseling, and evidence-based practices. The importance of evidence informed interventions, clinical judgment, and patient preferences will be stressed.

**Overview:** Therapeutic boundaries are the rules of the professional relationship. The purpose of these rules is to provide structure and safety in order to prevent harm to clients. However, not every boundary crossing is a problem, and some boundary crossings may even be helpful. This webinar will provide the opportunity to discuss ethical dilemmas related to accepting gifts, therapeutic touch, non-traditional settings for therapy, and non-sexual relationships after termination. The importance of consultation will also be emphasized. Participants are invited to discuss ethical dilemmas from their own practices.

- Articulate the difference between boundary crossings and boundary violations.
  - List and describe 3 ethical and risk management issues with subtle boundary crossings.
  - Make appropriate responses to 3 serious challenges to therapeutic boundaries.

Debra has held leadership roles in the child welfare arena for over 30 years and directed innovative child welfare programs nationally, including the New York Foundling Hospital’s Crisis Nursery and Boston City Hospital’s Sexual Abuse Team.

Linda K. Knauss, Ph.D., ABPP is a retired Professor at Widener University’s Institute for Graduate Clinical Psychology. Dr. Knauss is the Past-chair of the American Psychological Association’s Ethics Committee, the American Board of Professional Psychology’s Ethics Committee, the Pennsylvania Psychological Association’s Ethics Committee, and has served as Co-chair of the Philadelphia Society of Clinical Psychologists’ Ethics Committee.

Dr. Knauss taught courses in ethics at Widener University, Immaculata University, and the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine. She has authored several book chapters and journal articles on ethics and has taught many continuing education workshops on a variety of ethical issues.
